STORYTIME ACTIVITIES


- . SPECIAL RELEASE PARTY: Since Mouse and the other characters from the series are familiar friends to children, consider hosting a special event to celebrate the release of the newest book. Children can revisit old favorites through table activities and games before hearing If You Give a Mouse a Brownie.
- · PROVIDE PROPS: There are several chances to give the children props to hold up during the story. They can wave plastic spoons, show you their tickets, and pretend to sneeze with tissues. The children will pay close attention to see when it's time to use their props.
- . SEQUENCING: This is a great story to practice sequencing with the children. After reading the story, try to have them remember the order in which Mouse asks for things. Be prepared to prompt them if they get stuck.
- · STAGE A SHOW: After sharing the story, pass out musical instruments (egg shakers, tambourines, inflatable guitars, bells, etc.) and give the children a chance to perform their own rock concert. To make it extra special, invite caregivers or other students to attend their performance.
- PAPER BOATS: Incorporate science by challenging the children to make a paper boat. Attempt to float the boat in a kiddie pool or dishpan. Provide many different kinds of paper for the children to use, such as cardstock, newspaper, and copy paper.
