Virginia's Christmas Cookies

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Red and green sprinkles and colored sugar for decorating

Directions

- 1. You will need an adult's help to make these cookies.
- 2. In a medium-sized bowl, mix together the flour, baking powder, and salt.
- 3. In a large bowl, cream the butter and sugar, then add the eggs, one at a time, followed by the vanilla.
- 4. Beat until light and fluffy.
- 5. Gradually add the flour mixture, using a wooden spoon or rubber spatula, to the wet mixture and combine until the dough becomes thicker.
- 6. Chill the dough for at least 2 hours. After the dough has chilled, roll out small amounts of dough on a floured board until 1/8" thick.
- 7. Dip cookie cutters into flour to prevent sticking. Cut dough into shapes.
- 8. Bake at 350°F for 6–8 minutes or until edges are light golden brown. Remove cookies from baking sheets, decorate with sprinkles and colored sugar, and cool on wire racks.
