ABOUT THE BOOK

Before YOU came along, so many things were different! But now . . . there's laughter, a house full of adventures and toys, a million little surprises. . . . And so much love. From bestselling author Sherri Duskey Rinker and award-winning artist Patrick McDonnell comes this funny and tender love letter from a parent to a child.

INTERACTIVE ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS

- 1. In *Silly Wonderful You*, the parent tells of all the ways the little girl surprises her and makes her life better.

 After reading the book at your story time or event (or later at home), ask the children to come up with some other ordinary things they do to make everyday life extraordinary, exciting, and fun.
- 2. The author uses many dynamic words to describe the child in the book, such as giggly, splashy, crashy, grumpy, slimy, and grimy. Photocopy those pages from the book and cut out the words to make flashcards to help children learn their meanings.


 Ask children to come up with additional words that describe them.
- **3.** Before or after your story time, print copies of the *Silly Wonderful You* activity page in this guide and have each child complete the drawing exercise. Then encourage discussion among the group by asking each child to stand up and name one of the things they wrote or drew that makes him or her silly and wonderful.
- 4. Reverse the roles depicted in the book and ask children to write a letter or draw a picture describing how a parent or guardian is silly and wonderful.

 Set up a station with construction paper, crayons, markers, pencils, etc. for the children to work on their creations. Encourage them to take their letter or drawing home as a gift for their parent or guardian.






Silly Wonderful LOVE

Safety Note: Always be sure to ask permission from a grown-up before using scissors.






Silly Wonderful Animals

Bonus: Circle the elephant if you can find him!




Silly Wonderful YOU
