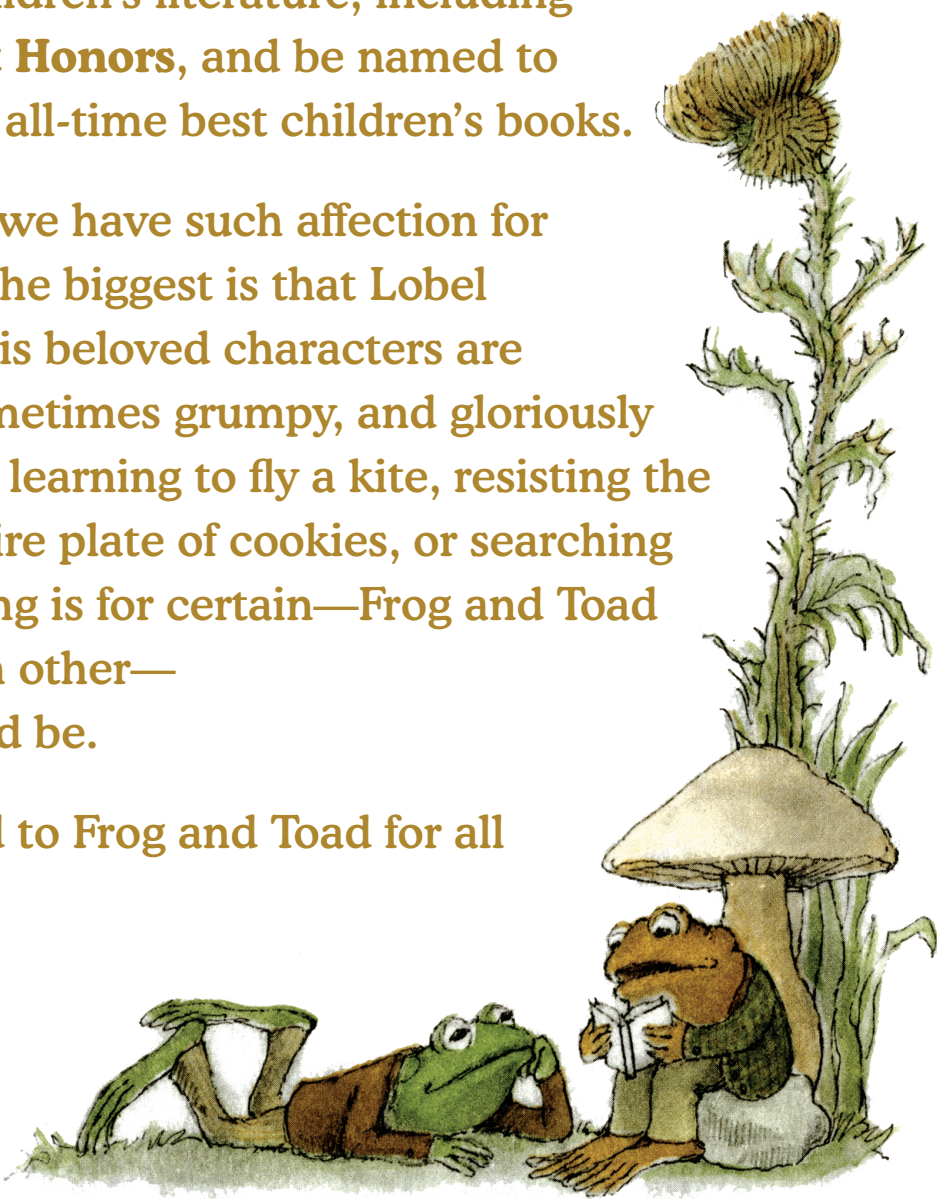
For decades, **Frog and Toad** have shown readers what true friendship is all about.
