

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

HOW I WON THE WORLD SERIES by Dan Gutman

- What is an underdog? Are you, like Dan Gutman, inclined to root for underdogs? Why or why not?
- Why is there no moral to this story? What do you think Dan Gutman means when he says, "It's just sports. Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose" (page 16)?

FIND YOUR FIRE by Tim Green

- How do sports encourage friendship, and how can they challenge it? Do you think Jake should have continued to go easy on Bobby, or should he have started playing at full strength? Explain.
- What does the story's title, "Find Your Fire," mean? How does Jake keep his fire burning after he doesn't get the scholarship to Immaculate Heart?

MAX SWINGS FOR THE FENCES by Anne Ursu

- Why does Max lie? Why does he keep lying? How can being the new kid at school be tough?
- Were you surprised that Molly was the team's pitcher? Why or why not? Were you surprised that she was playing Max all along? How can statements like "you throw like a girl" be insulting?

AGAINST ALL ODDS by Dustin Brown

- Hockey is Dustin Brown's "favorite thing to do in the world" (page 82). What's yours?
- What lesson does Dustin learn when he doesn't make the New York State Select 15? How does his self-motivation allow him to grow from the Tykes level to captain of the Los Angeles Kings?



THE DISTANCE by Jacqueline Woodson

- What qualities do you think make a good coach? How is Cashay's coach good for him?
- What gives Cashay the "desire to run it different" and go "way beyond regular" (page 116)?

THE MEAT GRINDER by Chris Crutcher

- Why doesn't Devin Mack have faith? How is his lack of faith related to his lack of self-worth?
- How does Rich Saxon help Devin? What is Rich's act of kindness, and why does it mean so much to Devin?
