- 2. Several countries have different versions of the ciguapa legend. Had you ever heard a version of the ciguapa story before reading A Touch of Moonlight?
- 3. Brynne sets Larimar up on a blind date with Ray after Larimar sent her a photo of him on Instagram. She does not tell Larimar she knows Ray is the man in the photo until much later. How would you feel if a friend kept this information from you?
- 4. Larimar finds herself living and reliving the experience of being accepted by a person or group and believing this acceptance hangs on them not knowing the truth about her identity. Does this experience resonate for you at all, and if so, how?
- 5. Ray hesitates to tell Larimar that he has been divorced. Why do you think this is?
- 6. Larimar considers telling the Rizos Curl Club that she's a ciguapa, but ends up not doing so. How do you imagine it would've gone if she had gone through with it?

 and punk rock. Why might they have felt
