- 4. Some characters in the book coped with death by leaning on their faith. For others it drove them away from their faith. Why the difference?
- 5. How soon is too soon to develop romantic feelings for another person in the aftermath of your own loss?
- 6. Colm was dying slowly and then decided to accelerate the process. Is there any moral difference?
- 7. Bones was an "end justifies the means" kind of cop rather than a rigid rule follower. What is more important to you—the right result or the right process?
- 8. Power changed some of the judges and some were unchanged. What part of human nature is impacted by power and why the different reactions to it?
- 9. Tiffany went to great lengths to frame her husband. Why is revenge chosen over simply leaving?
- 10. How thought-provoking did you find the book? Did the book change your opinion about anything, or did you learn something new from it? If so, what?
